Here are some basic pet photo tips:

1. **Get down to your pet's height.** If you kneel down...you actually can see the expressiveness in the pet's eyes. Otherwise you are only taking a photo of the top of his head and his features are distorted.

2. **Simple backgrounds.** Try to keep the backgrounds simple...watch for clutter.

3. **Frame your dog.** Use the zoom or move closer or further away to get what you are photographing. If you are going for a portrait get close, fill the frame with the dog's head.

4. **Flash.** If you have a black dog use a flash when taking a photo and you will get more detail and not just a dark blob.

If the ambient light is from behind the subject, use a flash and it will fill in detail. It is best to have ambient light coming from behind you or from the side when taking a photo.

If you have a red-eye flash on your camera now is the time to use it.

5. **Be patient.** Some have been lucky to catch that super photo in an instant but sometimes you have to wait.

Use a treat as an incentive or a squeaky toy to get that alert look.

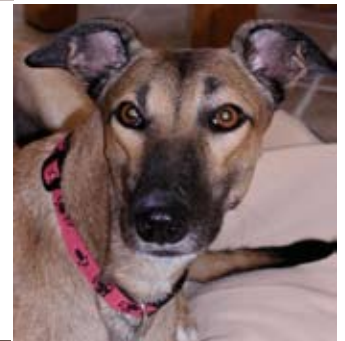
